

-MF100 MINIATURE FOREST OF TIERRA DEL FUEGO NATIONAL PARK-

Imagine appreciating the miniature forest, we bring you closer to an unknown world. The greatest variety of colors in nature, the different forms of lichens: crustose, foliose, fruticose, dysmorphic, mosses and liverworts. All this diversity is part of ecosystems such as evergreen forest, deciduous forest, and peat bogs.



Transfer from the hotel to Tierra del Fuego National Park. Different ecosystems in different areas of the National Park.

In Ensenada Bay, at first sight, the colorations of the rocks on the coast will call our attention. It is the expected moment to discover the first phenotype. With the magnifying glass in hand, we will observe the presence of a crustacean lichen. You will begin to glimpse a new world.



In the forest adjacent to the coast, the forms will flow, as well as the diversity: crustose, foliose, fruticose, dysmorphic, mosses that inhabit the evergreen forest (Winter Bark's, Evergreen beech, firebush, etc.).

Heading to the next observation area, it is time to get to know another relevant ecosystem in Tierra del Fuego: "The peatlands".



At Roca Lake it is time to learn what a lichen is, its structure, its forms, or phenotypes. The guide will provide the explanation with photographic material to understand even better what it implies.

Among the objectives we will be able to see with the magnifying glass, the reproductive system of the lichens. The right time to begin the expedition into the world of lichen diversity with our magnifying glasses.



Colors, shapes, varieties of lichens make you enjoy or have a unique experience in the forest of Tierra del Fuego.

Different activities will make the fun of this path to exploration: hiking, observation, photography, etc.

We will also enjoy a snack and a meal in a natural environment.

Our adventure ends at Lapataia Bay, from this point we return to the city.
